President's Message

WHAT A YEAR IT'S BEEN!

Together, the Sturdy team has touched so many lives for the better; providing immediate, compassionate care to over 48,000 patients in our Emergency Department; cultivating health and wellness during the 251,000 patient visits within Sturdy Memorial Associates; placing over 5,000 test kits in the hands (literally!) of local community members during a drive-thru event to help stop the spread of COVID-19; being the first hospital in Massachusetts to send critical medical supplies to our healthcare colleagues in Ukraine. Sturdy has demonstrated the powerful impact independent health systems make within the communities they serve... and beyond.

I think we can all agree that FY22 was one of extremes. The surge of COVID in January; the country's highest inflation in 20 years; unparalleled workforce shortages. While working through these daily pressures with an unwavering focus on providing the highest quality of care, we also dedicated time to developing a system-wide Strategic Plan. This plan provides our health system direction in how we will successfully recover from the financial impact of the last few years while becoming even stronger. Our Strategic Plan centers around our vision of being our Region's most trusted and preferred health care provider and employer. Financial recovery and sustainability is a key part of the Strategic Plan.

The human and financial impact of the pandemic, compounded with the escalating cost of goods and services, has left an indelible mark on the global healthcare system. As in your own homes, "from bacon to Band-Aids", our everyday expenses have skyrocketed. Sturdy has not been immune, seeing a \$20 million increase in supply costs since this same time last year. This unparalleled financial inflation, coupled with the steady decline of COVID related government relief funding, has reaffirmed

our need to embark upon a financial recovery and sustainability strategy as the foundation of our continued success. In doing so, Sturdy is dedicated to ensuring that the services our communities need are preserved.

Throughout FY22, Sturdy's pursuit of excellence never wavered. Time and again, we came together as a team, overcoming whatever we faced in that particular moment. A potent example of this being when our SMA physicians rotated to the hospital during the COVID surge to provide vital patient care, as well as invaluable support to their colleagues. In July 2022, Sturdy Hospital also underwent our annual hospital reaccreditation survey. Three DNV Surveyors audited numerous areas of the hospital to see firsthand the high quality, compassionate care we deliver each day. The Surveyors were very impressed with how Sturdy has hardwired processes, established a solid ISO foundation, and continues to positively mature. Clinical and non-clinical team members alike, the invaluable impact each makes on patient safety and care quality is profound, and it was immediately recognized. I am pleased to say Sturdy earned reaccreditation, an achievement we are very proud of.

Together, the Sturdy team began working on a key tactic in our health system's 5-year Strategic Plan centered on specialty care access and growth. This resulted in the launch of two new service lines: Spine surgery and vascular surgery. Now, local residents can receive more advanced care, close to home, right here at Sturdy.

FY22 saw the continued maturing of the medical group within the Sturdy Memorial system. This period marked another successful recruiting year for Sturdy Memorial Associates with the onboarding of 12 Physicians and 13 Advanced Practice Providers. Sturdy Memorial Associates was also named to the 2022 Harvard Pilgrim Health Care Physician Group Honor Roll which recognizes top tier performance in the areas of acute, chronic and preventative care nationally. Whether in or outside the medical offices, SMA remains focused on bettering the health of the communities we serve. Sturdy Orthopedic and Sports Medicine Associates is now the official Sports Medicine provider for both the Attleboro and Norton High Schools' athletic departments. Our orthopedic surgeons can be seen on the side lines during games making sure medical attention is available when it is needed.

I am always inspired by what is possible when you have a team with a strong sense of purpose and a shared strategic vision. We are revitalized with a dynamic leadership team equipped with the skills and strategic plan to lead us into a promising future. There is hard work ahead, but we have a focused and committed team to meet the challenges that await in the service of our patients and our community. We are excited to forge a brighter future, together.



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As I look back on FY22, I realize what a year it has been! Resilience and recovery are the two best words to describe it. For the third straight year, the Sturdy team courageously navigated the physically, emotionally and mentally bruising COVID pandemic, as they did so with not only with COVID patients, but also with the many non-COVID patients still requiring medical attention. 



2022 Grants, Sponsorships, and Community Support

Sturdy Memorial received a generous grant of \$15,000 to provide scalp cooling treatments in our Oncology Department to patients free of charge. This new service is an evidence-based method which can reduce chemotherapy induced alopecia, commonly known as hair loss. The grant was made by Mr. Andrew Kelson from Franklin, MA to honor of his late wife, Claire Kelson.

Sturdy Memorial received a \$20,000 grant for COVID-19 Relief from Community Health Systems Foundation. As a Community Hospital, the most significant challenge Sturdy faced this past year was ensuring the health and safety of our patients, community members and employees. Testing for COVID-19 is the best protection against the spread of the virus and this grant was used to purchase testing equipment for the drive-thru, on-site testing area allowing for community and staff testing.





IN MEMORY OF DR. RUDOLPH WALTER PIERCE

Dr. Rudolph Walter Pierce, passed at the age of 93 on March 22, 2022. Dr. Pierce practiced Obstetrics and Gynecology with Sturdy Memorial Hospital for 33 years. Throughout his tenure at Sturdy, he championed the introduction and adoption of a multitude of significant advances in medicine including electronic fetal heart monitoring, laparoscopic surgery and laser surgery.

He also served as Chief of the OB/GYN Department and Chair of the Executive Committee. In 1996, he retired from his practice at the OB-GYN Group of Attleboro. Dr. Charles Jablecki of La Jolla California gave a \$5,000 grant in honor Dr. Pierce to create a meditation space for staff in LDRP.

Lloyd G. Balfour FOUNDATION

Sturdy Memorial received a \$190,000 grant to establish a spine program at the Hospital from the Lloyd G. Balfour Foundation. The Spine Program at Sturdy Memorial offers surgical services designed to relieve problems in the cervical, thoracic and lumbar spine, virtually eliminating the need for open spine surgery or spinal fusions. These procedures bring lasting relief to patients suffering from spinal stenosis, herniated discs, sciatica, degenerative disc disease, failed back surgery syndrome, and more.

Sturdy Memorial received a \$15,525 grant from the Coverys Community Healthcare Foundation in support of Sturdy's Xenex disinfection robot program. The use of Xenex room disinfection robots has advanced Sturdy greatly in improving patient safety by adding UV light technology as an added layer of defense. Xenex's pulsed, high intensity, broad spectrum UV light technology is uniquely lethal to microorganisms and is 4,300 times more intense, in peak power, than a mercury lamp. Disinfection cycles are fast, allowing staff to disinfect a patient room in as little as 10 minutes and a surgical suite in 20 minutes or less.





Sturdy Memorial received a \$15,000 grant from Novo Nordisk to provide free Diabetes Education. Many patients in our community have either lost insurance coverage due to reductions in workforce and are experiencing income reductions. This grant will afford patient's flexibility to access the diabetes educational programs they need during this unprecedented time. The Diabetes Management Program at Sturdy focuses on the seven, self-care behaviors for improved health. These areas of education include: healthy eating and diet, being active and exercise, monitoring of blood sugar, proper taking of prescribed medications, including insulin, reducing risks or complications, problem solving and healthy coping.



Connecting Our Community: Just for the HEALTH of it!

FRIENDS OF JACK FOUNDATION

Sturdy is a proud supporter of Friends of the non-profit Friends of Jack Foundation whose mission is to enhance the physical, mental and emotional well-being of children across the region. One way they do this is through the Super Hero Bear program. Meant to reduce children's anxiety in stress situations, Friends of Jack provides a super hero mask, cape and cuddly bear sets to Emergency Departments like Sturdy to distribute to little ones to make a scary situation less so. They do this at absolutely no charge to the patient nor to Sturdy, and you can see from that smiling face that it is making a difference in our ED!

IN OUR COMMUNITIES

SUPPORTS ATHLETICS IN ATTLEBORO Sturdy Memorial is proud to support both the Attleboro and Norton High Schools athletics programs. Through this program, Sturdy orthopedic sports medicines physicians are on the side lines during key games to provide immediate medical attention should things not go to plan. They also provide free sports physicals and injury avoidance education to keep our community's student athletes playing for many years to come.

PLAYING IT SAFE: STURDY ORTHOPEDICS

AT-HOME COVID TEST KIT DISTRIBUTION

When at-home COVID Test Kits first became available, we recognizing the need to quickly get them in the hands and homes of our patients to make an impact on COVID spread. Through the great work of the Sturdy team, we were able to secure and hand out over 5,000 at-home test kits free of charge to our community during a drive-thru event held outside our 100 O'Neil Blvd building. Of course, we also made sure that each of our employees and their families received free test kits to have at home as well.

Through a generous donation from Stop-N-Shop, Sturdy Memorial provided over 4,000 bottles of free hand sanitizer to our community's schools, senior center and community partners such as Manet Community Health Center and New Hope. Sturdy also distributed free hand sanitizer to our patients and teams at the hospital main entrance, Emergency Department and each of our medical offices.

STURDY STANDS IN SOLIDARITY WITH OUR HEALTHCARE **COLLEAGUES IN UKRAINE**

The devastation of this senseless war has had a tremendous impact on the ability for Ukrainian healthcare providers to have the basic medical supplies need to care for the sick and wounded. Through the Massachusetts Health & Hospital Association, Sturdy was one of only 2 hospitals in our state to respond to the need for medical supplies, and the 1st to actually send them. You can be proud to know that a large shipping pallet of over \$7.5k in vital medical supplies was safely received in the Ukraine.

CANCER THRIVER-SHIP DAY

At the center of all was our annual Cancer Survivorship Day. While enjoying a day in Sturdy Memorial Hospital's Reflection Garden, we celebrated ways in which our former cancer patients can not only survive, but THRIVE. From exercise and healthy cooking demonstrations to an on-site therapeutic painting workshop where cancer survivors used the creation of art as a part of their long term healing, it was a day full of joy and celebration.







DONOR SPOTLIGHT: JUDITH FORGET, ATTLEBORO

Judith Forget, an Attleboro resident for 45 years was born at Sturdy Memorial Hospital in 1949 — Judith recalled that her mother, Mary Welcome, spent several days at Sturdy after her birth and she still has a copy of the original bill! Judith's mother and father. Charles, who lost his sight during World War II while serving in France raised their family in Seekonk, Massachusetts. Judith spends her time today overseeing family businesses, supporting local animal and service charities and is proud of her work keeping the 150 year-old tradition alive by organizing the Memorial Day Service at Hillside Cemetery



in Attleboro. In 2017 Judith lost her husband Donald M. Forget to whom she was married for 43 years after a battle with throat cancer. Judith's generous philanthropic support of Sturdy's Oncology Department honors the staff who took such good care of Don when he was sick. "The staff and nurses at Sturdy care so much. Don looked forward to his treatments because of the staff, like Oncology nurse, Ellen Gilbert" Judith remarked. Judith also said "having Sturdy in our community keeps care local, and am proud to support the work they do every day".

All giving to established Named Funds is added to the investment pool of the Foundation and shall exist in perpetuity. On an annual basis the realized annual investment income derived from the principal will be split with 50 percent being reinvested into the fund to grow the principal and 50 percent going to fund active initiatives at Sturdy Memorial Hospital designated by the donor.


